Summary:	 The 2019 budget : The 2019 flat-rate budget plans were prepared in line with all recommendations of the Zagreb General Assembly and are detailed in appendix 2 (including the current status of the planned action). The report about the ongoing execution of the 2019 budget is presented. For the 2020 budget : Proposals for the 2020 budget are presented. Some indication of the LACE 2020 budget is given here but, since there will be a LACE Council after the ALADIN GA, this may be subject still to changes. 1.Report about the ongoing execution of the 2019 budget

Flat rate budget

The appended document (prepared by P. Pottier and P. Termonia) describes the full status of the 2019 flat-rate budget planning, in line with all recommendations of the Zagreb General Assembly. It was sent to the relevant Partners on 04/02/2019 (the actions already done are in "green"; the canceled actions are in "red"; some replacements (person, location) without any financial impact are underlined in orange, the actions that are still planned to be realized before the end of 2019 remain not underlined).

Summing up, one can say that the following is seen from the Météo-France's non-LACE Partners side:

And the following is seen from the Météo-France's flat-rate compensation budget side:

Finally, the effective pure flat-rate balanced planned budget for 2019 is 99345 \in (= 96000 \notin + 3345 \in) and the effectively executed part is estimated to be 94621 \in (=93810 \notin - 5535 \in)¹.

In terms of absolute money transfers, Météo-France pays to RC-LACE 16605 \in (the money for the scientific visits supported by RC LACE Members 10430 \in , the MF contribution to the annual Workshop 3375 \in , the MF contribution of 2800 \in to the Code Architect and to the DA Coordinator). Météo-France also receives a balance of 23940 \in from the ensemble of the other (non-LACE) Partners (of course the direction and size of the transfer varies from country to country). All this would lead in practice to no surplus whatsoever for the total balanced amount in the central budget if there will be no backlog in the 2018 payments for all due sums. But there are 'compensations' due by some of the non-LACE Partners for total sum of 3345 \in (see APPENDIX B of the GA23 document 7_budget).

¹For the record, the effective pure flat-rate balanced budget since the end of MoU4 was :

- in 2014: **79090** € (of which only **64195** € were effectively executed)
- in 2015: 86015 € (of which only 79850 € were effectively executed)
- in 2016: 94165 € (of which only 89640 € were effectively executed)

- in 2018: 97966 € (of which only 94621 € were effectively executed)

On the RC LACE side one should best distinguish the 'incomes' side and the 'planned financed actions' side.

The direct income comes from the Members contributions and amounts to $166149 \in (NB: all seven Members pay at least the 2018 flat-rate of <math>12000 \in$). As there is not any more a royalty mechanism in MoU-5 no further contributions within the 'incomes' side are planned.

RC LACE acts as a bank for ALADIN FR-LACE scientific visits. MF dedicate the funds that RC LACE pays to scientists for mission at the same amount (13850 \in). Probably all planned ALADIN FR-LACE scientific visits (13850 \in) will be completed in 2019 (see flat-rate document in Appendix 2).

RC LACE acts as a bank for the MF and flat-rate partners contribution to the ALADIN-HIRLAM-Wk with the amount of **3375** \in and for the MF support to the Code Architect and the DA Coordinator positions (**2800** \in). MF dedicate the funds that RC LACE pays at the same amount.

The budget account is expected to end with an underspending in the amount of **7079** €. The difference between the 'incomes' side and the 'expenditures' side is accumulated to the budget reserve.

The RMI financed the missions of the ALADIN PM for 2019, providing a travel budget of 15.0 k€.

ACNA reserve

In 2012, the RMI received from LACE the non-spent part of the "ALADIN-2 money" given by MF to LACE until 2010, to support the ACNA mobility. This reserve was $19.882,79 \in$ at the end of 2012, $15360,60 \in$ at the end of 2013, $13989,25 \in$ at the end of 2014, $16264,22 \in (12514,22 \in + 3750 \in \text{transferred by LACE})$ at the end of 2015, $14567,57 \in$ at the end of 2016, $12880,17 \in$ at the end of 2017, $11369,03 \in$ at the end of 2018 and is estimated at $9619,42 \in$ at the end of 2019.

2. Proposals for the 2020 budget

2020 resources :

- The inflation² for 2018 in the Euro zone is 1.8%. According to the MoU-5, the flat-rate sum of 12000€ in 2019 should be augmented by the inflation over the previous year, thus the **flat-rate ceiling reaches 12215** €.
- **5535** € will be transferred from the 2019 to the 2020 budget, due to some non-executed actions in 2019.

<u>2020 expenses :</u>

- We propose to keep the same spending as for 2019 as the baseline for the regular missions (PAC, LTM, Wk, EWGLAM, WD), taking into account the places of the meetings and the organization of two PAC meetings. Additional funding is considered for the missions of some flat-rate scientific experts to the Strategy meeting in Toulouse (but organizational costs fall into MF budget).
- **32k**€ are supported by the ALADIN budget for the ½ F.T.E. of the Code Architect (i.e. 2k€ per member).
- **12.8k**€ are supported by the ALADIN budget for the 0.2 F.T.E. of the DA Coordinator (i.e. 0.8k€ per member).
- The organisation of the Joint ALADIN Wk & HIRLAM ASM that will be held in Ljubljana in 2020 will fall into the LACE budget (see chapter 6 of the flat-rate document).

All the above being taken into account, below is the draft proposal for the 2020 ALADIN budget.

The direct income comes from the Members contributions and amounts to 166715 € (source: draft

RC LACE acts as a bank for ALADIN FR-LACE scientific visits. MF dedicate the funds that LACE pays to scientists for mission at the same amount (12000 €).

RC LACE acts as a bank for MF contribution to the Code Architect and the DA coordinator positions. MF dedicate the funds that LACE pays to the NMS of the Code Architect at the same amount (2800 \in).

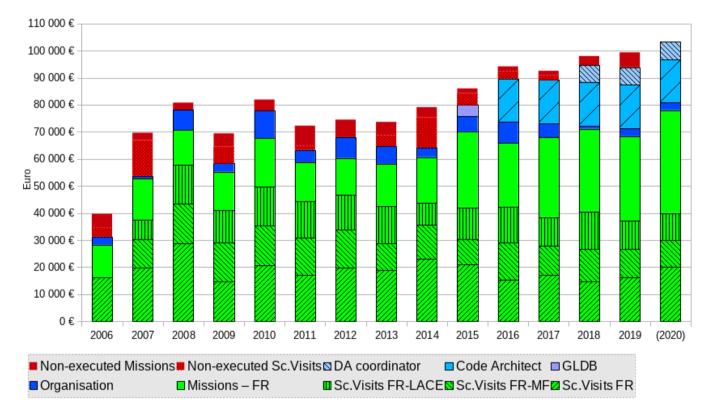

b) The flat-rate mechanism and its achievement

Besides the administrative complexity of the so-called "flat-rate budget", 92% of the planned flat-rate actions are realised on-time (although the plans are established in January for the whole year, for scientific visits and missions, at a time when not all events, especially working weeks, are fully known):

- Some visits are delayed or cancelled, generally due to personal constraints of the visitors (some visits are planned 10 months in advance).
- The LTM missions to the annual workshop or to the EWGLAM/SRNWP meeting were better realised in the recent years, but not in this year 2019.
- RC-LACE acts as a bank for some scientific visits and for the whole ALADIN consortium for money exchanges with HIRLAM (annual workshop, Code Architect, DA coordinator, ...); that gives some flexibility to the realisation of the flat-rate budget.
- See the below figure for the evolution of the flat-rate budget with the yearly expenses for :
 - the missions : PAC, LTM and CSSI at the annual Workshop or EWGLAM, working days, .. (in green when executed, non executed ones in red),
 - the scientific visits (in green when executed, non executed ones in red),
 - organisation costs (annual Workshop, working weeks, working days, PAC or General Assembly, leaflet printing, ...),
 - GLDB (funding of the maintenance of the Global Lake Data Base by ALADIN, only in 2015),
 - CA (funding for the Code Architect position, from 2016).
 - DA coordinator (funding for the DA coordinator position, from 2018)



Breakdown of the annual flat-rate budget

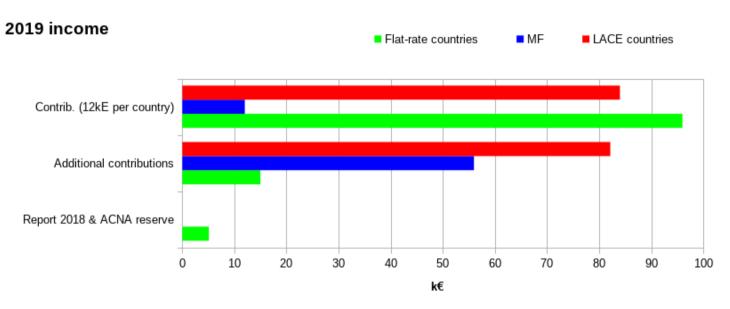
Realization of the past flat-rate budgets and possibilities for 2020

c) Summary of the 2019 ALADIN budgets

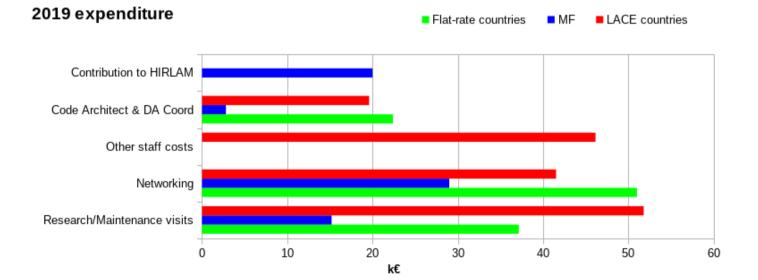
The ALADIN Annual Budget comprises three parts :

- a minimum flat rate financial contribution applicable to all Members aimed at covering the absolute minimum necessary volume of the tasks ...
- additional voluntary financial contributions of Members or grouping of Members ...
- 'in-kind' contributions corresponding in general to consortium-level tasks .

The financial contributions of Members that are also members of the RC-LACE, including their individual minimum flat rate contributions, are contributed and administrated through RC-LACE, the contributions of the other Members (besides MF) are administrated according to the flat-rate mechanism.

Appendix 2 : 2019 Flat-rate planning

The document was prepared in line with all recommendations of the Zagreb GA. It was distributed to the relevant Partners at the beginning of February 2019.

- some replacement (person, location) without any financial impact are underlined in orange (none, so far)
- the actions that are still planned to be realized before the end of 2019 remain not underlined

2019 Management of the flat rate contribution for non-LACE Members

The annual ALADIN budget comprises a flat rate contribution. It must finance the expenditures related to administrative or cooperation overheads and mobility in accordance with the ALADIN' Programme and its annual work plan.

For the non-LACE Members, Météo-France proposes a management procedure. This document details this procedure for 2019.

In order to reduce the volume of the money flow associated with the management of the flat rate contributions, each Member pays from its own budget all expenditures related to administrative or cooperation overheads and mobility for which he/she carries out the financial control in accordance with the annual work plan. Reimbursement of these expenses by the central budget is done separately.

Chapter 1 - Transport and per diem compensation rates

For equity reasons, homogeneous compensation rates per destination have been established. Of course, each Member will apply its usual rules and rates for the missions carried out by its employees. The above cost rates correspond to the amount of money taken into account by the ALADIN budget (it could be higher or lower than the real cost of the missions paid by the Members).

The column "TOTAL" gives the amount to be paid (if positive number) or to be received (if negative number) by each Member in case of use of the differential payment choice. In case of absolute payment choice the Member pays 12000€ (or more if the "TOTAL" is above 12000) and gets a sum (if any) so that the balance corresponds to the above "TOTAL" value.

Chapter 5 - Concrete rules

The compensation rates for travel and per-diem expenditure (tables in Chapter 1) will be used to compute the money transfers. **The actual cost will not be taken into account.**

The bilateral conventions which have been signed between Météo-France and the relevant Meteorological Institutes in February 2016 are valid until end of 2020 and continue to serve as justifications for the transfers of money.

The local liaison with Directors and the practical arrangements for the execution of the ALADIN Programme and plans (described in this document) is under the responsibility of each LTM. Accordingly, each LTM may refer to the decisions taken in the General Assembly in Krakow (21st November 2018, see the approved Minutes on the ALADIN web page).

Chapter 6 - Contribution to the Joint ALADIN & HIRLAM annual workshops

In 2007, it was decided between the ALADIN and HIRLAM Consortia that the gathering of ALADIN Workshop and HIRLAM All Staff Meeting (joint venues since 2006) would be financed to 50% by the organising National Meteorological Service and to 25% by each Consortium. The latter contribution was fixed for the duration of the ALADIN and HIRLAM MoUs (i.e. until 2020) top a bulk sum of 6000 €.

In the alternating scheme of organisation (HIRLAM on odd years and ALADIN on even years, plus rotation in each Consortium) this induces two differing situations:

• In even years, one ALADIN Country organises and the 6000 € falls in the relevant part of the ALADIN budget (Météo-France if the venue is in France, RC-LACE for a venue in one LACE country and the 'flat-rate budget' otherwise). The rotation ensures the long-term fairness of this mechanism.

• In odd years HIRLAM organises (Spain in 2019) and will send an invoice of 6000 € to

the ALADIN community. Since HIRLAM clearly prefers to send a single bill rather than three separate ones, it was agreed that the sending would be done (and for the first time in 2009) to RC LACE and that RC LACE would get in compensation the sum corresponding to the (equally shared, in the spirit of the flat-rate budget) contribution of other partners (6000* 8/16 for flat-rate partners and 6000*1/16 for Météo-France). This compensation should happen via the balancing mechanism between the flat-rate budget and the RC LACE budget, otherwise already used for the collecting and transfer (the other way round) of the Turkish entry fee and for the bulk support to 'flat-rate research stays' organised by RC LACE Members.

This year, the second mechanism applies since HIRLAM is the organizer.

Chapter 7 - Code Architect and DA Coordinator

For the benefit of the whole ALADIN Consortium and in the spirit of the joint declaration by the ALADIN General Assembly and the HIRLAM Council (Reading, 2 Dec. 2014), the 5th ALADIN MoU tasks "a Code Architect (CA) to assist the Programme Manager with the definition and the implementation of the ALADIN Canonical Model Configurations" (see article 5, item 43.iv of the 5th ALADIN MoU). The 21st ALADIN General Assembly (Krakow, 21 Nov. 2017) also tasks a "Data Assimilation Coordinator (DA Coord) to assist the Programme Manager with the coordination of the ALADIN DA starter countries with their DA activities, of the basic kit DA core program and with the elaboration of the ALADIN-HIRLAM common work plan for the DA basic kit core program".

Every country (Météo-France, RC LACE Partners and non-LACE Partners) will support the activities and the mobility of the CA and the DA Coord. It was agreed that Belgium would pay for the whole non-LACE non-MF Partners (Code Architect part) and that Portugal would pay for the whole non-LACE non-MF Partners (DA coordinator part); the RC-LACE would pay for the RC LACE Partners and Météo-France and would get in compensation the sum corresponding to MF contribution (2800 Euro). This contribution should be transferred by the balancing mechanism between the flat-rate budget and the RC LACE budget, otherwise already used for contribution to the annual joint ALADIN-HIRLAM workshops (see Chapter 6) and for the bulk support to 'flat-rate research stays' organised by RC LACE Members.

Chapter 8 - LACE redirection

In the spirit of the flat-rate budget, it was decided, when the latter was established, that every country, even Météo-France and RC LACE Partners, would be bound to support the Programme at least at the level of the annually 'fixed contribution' (for non M-F and non LACE ALADIN Members). In practice this means that no RC LACE Partner should pay less than the said sum to the central LACE budget and that, should there be a difference between this 'raised contribution' and what the RC LACE Partner would have paid otherwise, the difference should contribute to the 'flat-rate ALADIN budget'. This contribution should be transferred by the balancing mechanism explained above. The situation mentioned here happened in 2009, 2010 and 2011. It is no longer the case since 2012.

So, RC LACE is entitled to receive a contribution of 16605 € from the ALADIN 2019 flatrate budget :

- + 10430 : Specific RC-LACE financed stays
- + 3375 : Contribution to the annual workshop

- + 2800 : Contribution to the mobility for the Code Architect and the DA coordinator
- + 0 : LACE redirection

Chapter 9 - Practical decisions for the management of 2019 actions plus further questions

Some partners have chosen to work with Météo-France in "differential mode": they fund the actions under their own national rules and internal logistics. In terms of ALADIN compensation rates, the corresponding amounts are deduced from their flat-rate contribution. Thus, they only pay the residual amount (of course, those countries having a negative residual amount will receive money).

The other countries ("absolute mode") pay the total flat-rate amount to the budget (12000 \in) and will receive an amount of money corresponding to the actions they funded (they also fund the actions under their own national rules and internal logistics).

Each Partner will receive from Météo-France an official letter with the amount of money to be exchanged for the 2019 flat-rate. **Each Partner should send <u>these letters back, once</u> <u>signed before March 15, 2019</u> : with these signed letters, Météo-France will begin the money transfers to the Partners who will receive money and will send a bill to the others.**

Chapter 10 - Overview of the budgetary matters as decided by the Zagreb G.A. (19/11/2018)

The 2019 flat-rate contribution is 12000 Euro as decided by GA.

I hereby certify that the above document represents the most accurate and appropriate possible status of the foreseen execution of the ALADIN 2019 'flat-rate' budget, in accordance with the fifth ALADIN MoU and with the decisions of the last ALADIN General Assembly in November 2018.

I therefore ask all ALADIN active persons in the relevant Members (Directions, LTMs, Contact Points, Administrative support people) to do all possible efforts so that the execution of the actions (missions and stays) happens in accordance with the plan for the remaining part of the year. In this way, we shall have a most truthful correspondence between the financing and scientific-technical aspects of our activities for 2019, as well as a good basis to prepare the 2020 execution rules.
